Graham currently serves as coordinator of visual and performing arts at Richland One School District. He holds bachelor of music and master of music: choral conducting degrees from the University of South Carolina. He has directed several school choruses, as well as directing and acting in area theaters. In 2016, he was selected as one of "Top Twenty Under 40" by The State Media Company as an outstanding young professional helping to build the Midlands.

The Palmetto Mastersingers have been entertaining audiences in Columbia, in South Carolina, nationally and internationally since 1981. Dr. Arpad Darazs, then on the music faculty of the University of South Carolina, organized the group with the idea that there should be an opportunity for men to continue presenting outstanding choral music after leaving the college environment. The Mastersingers have performed in the Notre Dame in Paris, St. Peter's in the Vatican, St. Mark's in Venice, St. Stephen's in Budapest, and other venues in France, Germany, Italy, Russia, China, and Canada. The group is officially designated as "South Carolina's Musical Ambassadors."
