

DR. BENJAMIN STOGNER Artistic Director for The Palmetto Mastersingers



Dr. Benjamin Stogner holds a Doctorate in Musical Arts in Vocal Performance from the University of South Carolina, and a Master's in Music Education from Liberty University. With a passion for choral conducting and performance, Dr. Stogner has carved an impressive path in academia and the church.

Beginning as a rehearsal conductor at Court Street United Methodist Church in Lynchburg, VA, Dr. Stogner honed his skills in leading choral ensembles. This experience laid the foundation for

the subsequent role as Director of Worship at Greenhill Baptist Church, where he not only led the choir but also conducted the accompanying orchestra, fostering a rich and harmonious worship experience.

Currently, Dr. Stogner serves as the Minister of Music at Florence Baptist Church in Forest City, North Carolina, where his leadership continues to inspire and uplift the congregation through music. His dedication to musical excellence is evident not only within the church walls but also throughout the community.

Beyond his church commitments, Dr. Stogner has showcased his talent on the operatic stage, portraying memorable roles such as the Count in "The Marriage of Figaro" at the University of South Carolina and the Police Sergeant in "The Pirates of Penzance" at Liberty University. His versatility as a performer is further demonstrated through his involvement in various musical events and recitals across the city, captivating audiences with his expressive and powerful voice.

As a member of the esteemed Palmetto Mastersingers, Dr. Stogner has contributed his talents to enriching the local choral landscape. Recently, he has taken on the role of Artistic Director of this great organization.

Driven by a deep love for music and a commitment to excellence, Dr. Stogner continues to make a profound impact on both the spiritual and artistic communities he serves.



Allison Hudson Hilbish

H aving grown up in Columbia, Allison has spent her life at the heart of its local musical scene. She received her Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from the University of South Carolina after obtaining an Associate of Arts Degree from Anderson Junior College. Allison is very passionate about the art of accompanying, has been the pianist for many choral groups in the area, and is currently the pianist for the Columbia Choral Society and the Palmetto Mastersingers. She was the staff accompanist at Columbia College for over 10 years and is currently the pianist for Saint Andrews Presbyterian Church and a staff accompanist at Newberry College.



Arpad Darazs 1922 – 1986



A rpad Darazs was a native of Hungary. From 1941 to 1947, he earned three degrees from the Royal Franz Liszt Music Conservatory in Budapest. He was conductor of the Hungarian State Radio Network. He emigrated to the United States and was a music instructor at Malloy College and Columbia University before coming to the University of South Carolina in 1966 as professor of music and director of choral activities. He earned a Ph.D. from Columbia University in 1972.

Dr. Darazs was a protégé of renowned Hungarian composer

Zoltan Kodaly and was an authority on the Kodaly method of choral instruction. While at USC, Darazs founded the Concert Choir and was conductor of the Columbia Philharmonic Orchestra. He organized the Palmetto Mastersingers in 1981 to promote the male choral repertoire beyond the college walls. In 1985, he was awarded the Elizabeth O'Neill Verner award for his contributions and achievement in and to the arts in South Carolina.

In recognition of this heritage, our concerts from time to time will feature compositions by Kodaly and arrangements by Darazs.

Tonight's program features familiar patriotic melodies befitting the observance of Memorial Day. Though not as well known, we include two newer songs we find particularly moving.

Tell My Father is from the musical The Civil War. It tells the story of a young Union soldier who contemplates his own death in battle, hoping that his father will know of his bravery. "Tell my father when you can, I was a man."

We Shall Not Sleep is a recent musical setting of the poem, "In Flanders Fields." Canadian physician Lt. Col. John McCrae was inspired to write it in 1915 after presiding over the funeral of a fellow soldier who died in the battle of Ypres. "In Flanders Fields the poppies grow, between the crosses row on row." Red poppies grew over the graves of fallen soldiers, and the remembrance poppy became one of the world's most recognized memorial symbols for soldiers who died in combat.
